Circular Economy

We support and elevate efforts of local businesses and institutions working to create a circular economy in their communities and industries.

The Forum is West Michigan's leading advocate for recycling and solid waste diversion. We promote a circular economy mindset and the understanding that waste has economic value, providing support to businesses and organizations through our partnership program and educational engagements.

We are among the only groups in the state working to promote the intersectionality of materials management, climate and justice, including engagement efforts that are helping to inform recycling contamination interventions and market development initiatives

locally and statewide.

In 2022 we launched an expanded circularity program that will encourage the use of recycled content in the state, while working to address a series of local, state and national issues in partneship with industry and the public sector.

WORKING GROUPS AND SUPPORT

We are providing businesses and institutions resources, guidance, and peer learning to support the adoption or execution of zero waste to landfill initiatives. This includes user groups, roundtables and strategic partnerships.



CIRCULARITY FORUM & RECYCLED CONTENT

The Circularity Forum is challenging manufacturers and major purchasers to support or create end markets for recycled content through design innovation and intentional purchasing.



CLIMATE SOLUTIONS AND FOOD WASTE

In 2023 we will lead statewide coalitions to develop a Food Waste Reduction Road Map and to examine and address end-of-life issues for renewable energy components and energy efficiency solutions. We are working to improve connections between climate solutions and recycling.



SUSTAINABLE MATERIALS MANAGEMENT

We are supporting community-scale efforts to improve sustainable materials management, this year leading a seven-county stakeholder engagement process in Southwest Michigan and again sampling municipal solid waste streams as part of an update to our Michigan MSW Valuation Study.



Equity and Sustainability


Sustainable business should center social and environmental justice, providing a mechanism for businesses and institutions to dismantle and support alternatives to white supremacy.

Sustainable business has a responsibility to work alongside under-resourced populations and communities of color to address historical disparate impacts affecting members of these communities due to public policy or market-based actions. We are highlighting the potential role of the business community as advocates for business practices and civic priorities that advance social and environmental justice. We are engaging businesses in an active process to identify and eliminate racism, while working to decrease barriers to participation in sustainability for diverse groups.


ENGAGEMENT FOR ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

In partnership with the Roosevelt Park Neighborhood Association, we are working to address environmental justice issues in Southwest Grand Rapids, which has been especially impacted by the operations of heavy industry.



Climate Leadership

Our Vision: Through business leadership, Michigan can eliminate net greenhouse gas emissions and contribute to a future where GHGs in the atmosphere are declining.

Through our members and partners, we are advocating for climate leadership goals and promoting resources for energy efficiency, regenerative agriculture, clean energy and other solutions to reduce emissions and sequester carbon. The investments being made today are going to reshape our economy for the next generation. We are working to accelerate these solutions and make sure they are done right.

This includes important initiatives that protect water quality through green stormwater infrastructure and rainscaping.

We are also partnering with local, national campaigns to advocate for climate leadership in the public sector. We have been active in Michigan's climate solutions planning and have developed expertise to support supply chain and stakeholder education.


